Replace rocks quickly and carefully if you look underneath

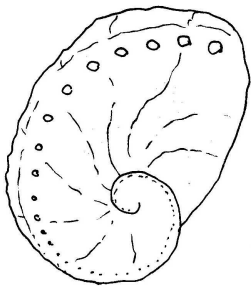
Collect as many crabs as you can

Pull off living seaweed

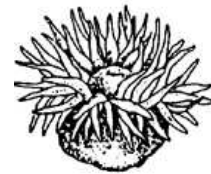

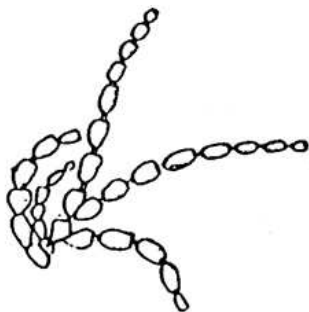

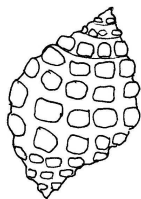

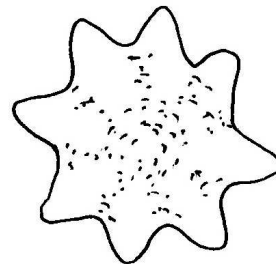

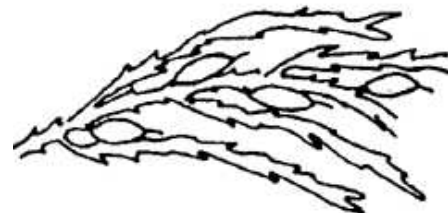
